

AGRICULTURAL PROPERTY COVERAGE

EXTENSION OF COVERAGE – LIVESTOCK LIMITED MORTALITY

This Endorsement Changes the Policy. Please Read It Carefully.

Certain words and phrases that appear in bold have special meaning as defined below or in the form to which this Endorsement is attached.

The titles of sections or paragraphs listed below should not be considered for purposes of interpreting the intent of this Endorsement; these titles have only been inserted for ease of reading.

This Endorsement is attached to the Livestock - Broad Form, and, except as otherwise provided under this Endorsement, is subject to all terms, conditions, limitations and exclusions of such Form.

1. LIMITED MORTALITY

Notwithstanding any contrary provision contained under this Policy, the insurance provided by this Form is extended to cover direct physical loss or direct physical damage caused to **livestock** due to **limited mortality** circumstances.

2. LIMIT OF INSURANCE

This Extension of Coverage shall not increase the amount of insurance stated in the Declaration Page(s) for Livestock.

3. DEDUCTIBLE

The Insurer is liable for the amount by which the direct physical loss or direct physical damage caused by an insured peril exceeds the amount of the deductible specified in the Declaration Page(s) in any one occurrence.

4. ADDITIONAL DEFINITION

For the purpose of this Endorsement, the following definition is added to the **DEFINITIONS** section:

1. **Limited mortality** means:

- 1.1. suffocation of **livestock** in its own fluids including when caused by **livestock** inherent inability to regain an upright position;
- 1.2. indigestion sustained by **livestock** after ingesting food or other foreign objects;
- 1.3. colic (twisted gut);
- 1.4. bloating (meteorism), but only when bloat is a direct result of the ingestion of feed;
- 1.5. rabies, for which the Insurer will cover only in excess of government indemnities;
- 1.6. blackleg disease;
- 1.7. milk fever;
- 1.8. **livestock** parturition. The Insurer shall pay the **Insured** for:
 - 1.8.1. death of an adult **livestock**, excluding the offspring;
 - 1.8.2. slaughtering of an adult **livestock** made necessary due to physical injuries sustained by such adult **livestock**, excluding the offspring; or arising from or occurring as a result of the parturition of an offspring. Death or slaughtering must occur within seventy-two (72) hours of the parturition.

All other terms and conditions of the Policy remain unchanged.
